Objective

Australia and Japan can work in partnership to improve access to ethical, stable and safe batteries throughout the Indo-Pacific, reducing the region's reliance on unsustainable energy sources. Our nations have complementary strengths in the critical minerals and battery manufacturing supply chains. Batteries for energy storage allow both countries to make better use of intermittent renewables for key industries from green metals to data centres. Batteries are also key to the electrification of vehicles and heavy machinery manufactured in both countries.

By supporting and working with Australia's battery industry, both nations can derive a greater benefit from the global transition. Through the National Battery Strategy and associated measures, Australia is committed to working with key partners like Japan to diversify global supply chains and secure our energy transformation and net zero goals.

This event will include presentations from three Australian experts on sharing insights on the latest in battery technologies and supply chains, and Australia's strengths in this global industry. An open panel discussion will follow, with a networking lunch afterwards.
