2. OCCI AND COLOMBIA: CLOSER TIES, MORE ACTIVITY

Readers may remember our report of a courtesy visit by Santiago Pardo, the Colombian ambassador to Japan, to then-OCCI Chairperson Hiroshi Ozaki, and Ambassador Pardo's participation in a well-attended business seminar that same day. The meeting and seminar, combined with OCCI Vice-Chair Junzo Tateno's supporting role as Colombia's honorary consul-general in Osaka and comprehensive support from the Colombian embassy, have sparked a surge in innovation-oriented exchanges between Japanese and Colombian businesses.

Examples of this increased momentum include a Japan-Colombia startup exchange forum hosted by the Osaka Innovation Hub in April 2022, and the scheduled participation of three Colombian startups (the most from any country) in GIF Osaka 2022 in June.

Other examples of the increasingly strong ties and cooperation between Colombia and the OCCI include a courtesy visit by Hiroshi Wago Rojas, vicepresident of international strategy and innovation at Procolombia, Colombia's trade promotion organization, to the OCCI in May 2022, where he met with

3. THE BUSINESS MALL OFFERS ASSISTANCE FOR SMES IMPACTED BY RECENT INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

The Business Mall, a website administered by the OCCI with the participation of 517 chambers of commerce nationwide to help SMEs forge new sales channels announced on April 15 the start of a special "Buyers Find Suppliers, Suppliers Find Buyers" drive, which lasts through the end of September 2022. The initiative is aimed at helping SMEs struggling under the impact of recent international developments.

The "Buyers Find Suppliers, Suppliers Find Buyers" drive is just one of the OCCI's initiatives under the chamber's SME Challenge Project "Yatte Minahare."

The Japan Association for the 2025 World Exposition is delighted to announce that "The Policy for the Sustainable Expo 2025 Osaka, Kansai, Japan" has been launched.

In addition, "Expo 2025 Green Vision," announced in June 2021, has revised and disclosed. The revisions concern decarbonization and resource recycling, which are considered to be the most important thing in the above policy, and appropriate directions for the Expo, potential core measures, and more.

This revised vision describes not only already announced measures related to energy, but also measures related to fields such as site maintenance, operation, visitors, and discussions by the Expo 2025 Green Vision Realization Task Force. This vision aims for "the realization of carbon neutrality at the Expo and presentation of a carbon-neutral society in 2050," as well as "the realization of a circular economy (zero waste, zero food
