1. WORLD EXPO COMES TO AN END

After 184 days of fun, excitement, and fascination, Expo 2025 Osaka,

Kansai, Japan reached its closing ceremony on October 13. The second World Expo to be held in Osaka (after 1970), this year's edition featured some 158 countries and regions and seven international organizations, and attracted more than 25 million visits.

During that period, we at the OCCI fielded no less than 518 requests from various global governments and institutions looking to parlay their participation in the expo into new developments. We also entered into 20 MOAs/MOUs with international organizations that came to Osaka; helped a variety of people and organizations hold more than 300 seminars and meeting-and-matching events; hosted some 100 courtesy calls and briefings; lent support to some 432 SMEs via the Reborn Challenges at the Osaka Healthcare Pavilion; and facilitated 31 expo-related business orders via our online business matching platform. In addition to those activities, we strove to harness the expo's potential to spark international exchange in a broad range of ways, including the All

Osaka's a Stage initiative to spread the word about what makes Osaka a great place to visit and do business, as well as the themed weeks project carried out by the World Economic Forum's Global Shapers Community Osaka Hub.

The conclusion of World Expo 2025 has not dimmed our determination, and we look forward to providing comprehensive support for business exchanges and other activities to fully harness the opportunities generated by the event, and to ensure that its legacy is long and positive.

The OCCI teamed up with the Korea Creative Content Agency (KOCCA), a government agency, to hold U-KNOCK 2025 in Osaka x GIF Osaka, on October 29 and 30, 2025. The combined event provided a platform for the Korean startups to pitch to interested audiences, and facilitated matching and meeting between with Japanese companies.

Korean content is quickly gaining audiences worldwide on YouTube, Netflix, and the like, and reps from the Japanese companies participating in this event predicted that any resulting tie-ups would have a positive effect on the Japanese content industry.


The Asia Pacific Institute of Research (APIR) released its Kansai Economic Outlook 2025 on October 2, 2025. Regarding the long-term outlook for labor supply and demand in the Kansai region, the institute estimates that, by the time the integrated resort (which includes a casino) planned for Osaka opens in 2030, there will be a shortage of 330,000 workers in the accommodation and food service industries. Conversely, the institute hopes that, as Japan's first integrated resort, the facility will serve to add momentum to the Kansai economy. Construction is already underway on Yumeshima, the reclaimed island in Osaka Bay that recently hosted the World Expo. Under current plans, the resort will open in the autumn of 2030. Meanwhile, the institute is forecasting Kansai's (i.e., Osaka, Kyoto, Hyogo, Nara, Wakayama, and Shiga) gross regional product (GRP) will grow 0.3% in FY2025. This is slightly lower than the forecast growth rate of GDP for Japan as a whole (0.4%). The Kansai economy has traditionally been upheld by the manufacturing sector, including electrical devices and electronic components. However, the rise of inbound tourism and other local-consumption activity is causing the center of gravity to shift toward non-manufacturing sectors.
